Abdul Razzak Rumane was honoured as life patron of International Biographical Association, Cambridge, England at the 28th International Congress on Arts and Communication held at St John's College, University of Cambridge, England from July 15 to 22. Rumane was honoured to become the life member of London Diplomatic Academy consisting of allied group of scientists and diplomats from all over the world.
